Our next meeting will be a club meeting at the same new location.

We will no longer be meeting at the Ocean Breeze Country Club. For the next two meetings we will meet at **Speranza in downtown Boca Raton.**



Speranza is located near the corner of Palmetto Park Rd and Federal Hwy.

Although there is some parking in the rear and along Palmetto Park Rd, the best place to park is across the street in the parking lot on the Southeast corner of Palmetto Park Rd and Federal Hwy.

If you are coming from I-95, exit east on Palmetto Park Rd. As soon as you cross Federal Hwy, you will see Speranza on the left (north side). Take the first right and you will be able to enter the parking lot.

If you are coming from the south (driving north) on Federal Hwy, turn right just before the light to enter the parking lot. You can loop around if you miss the turn by turning right onto Palmetto Park Rd.

If you are coming from the north (driving south) on Federal, turn left at the first street after crossing Palmetto Park Rd to enter the parking lot (no left turn allowed onto Palmetto Park Rd).

Come early to place your meal order.

The project works in two levels: Boca Raton Rotary club members contribute \$5 to establish prize money, local youth groups are encouraged to compete for best Green Cup project. Projects done during May and June are judged by

mayor and club presidents early in June. The top 3 or 4 projects get proportional prize money to use for their youth organization.
