The June Issue of *ACResolution* will feature "New Voices," the winners of the 2016 ACR competition for presenters at its annual conference.

As an addition to this issue, we would like to feature brief reviews of "Best Books on Conflict Resolution, written by current graduate students in the field. We anticipate publishing 10-12 winners, depending on space.

The Requirements:

- The author must be currently enrolled in a Certificate, MA, or PhD program in Conflict Resolution or Related Fields.
- The commentary / review needs to be 300 500 words in length
- Submissions are due by May 26, 2017.
- Submissions should be made as MSWord documents, and sent as e-mail attachments.
- Authors will be required to sign a statement of originality and a release upon acceptance of their review.

Some Advice:

- Write for a general, not an academic or scholarly audience
