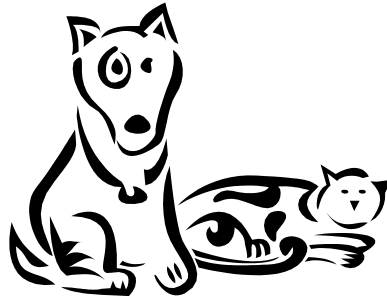

Details: Applicants must be a government entity or a 501(c)(3) organization located in Colorado or directly benefitting Colorado pet owners. Grant or long-term funding, endowment funds, or retirement of debt will not be considered. Focus is on making grants that demonstrate new approaches to animal care and understanding the importance of animals. Priorities are to promote the welfare of animals regarding (1) accessibility to care, (2) quality of care, and (3) self-sufficiency of animal care organizations.

Deadline: September 25. The Foundation only considers one request from an organization during any 12-month period.

The Foundation will not make grants to individuals or for-profit organizations. In addition, the Foundation has a geographic limitation that requires that grant funds be used in Bandera, Bexar, Comal, and Kendall counties in Texas. Programs areas include the prevention of cruelty to animals and the expansion or improvement of public parks, zoos, and wildlife sanctuaries. The Foundation also supports culture and health and human services.

Meacham grants are awarded only for animal environment enrichment, equipment that directly impacts the welfare of animals in the shelter, construction or capital improvements. Meacham grants may not be used for supplementing an agency's operating budget, reducing deficits, purchasing vehicles, or for routine maintenance.
