- **Goals:**

➤ **Goals:** *To ensure that nonprofit and faith-based organizations serving San Francisco's vulnerable populations are prepared for a disaster; to play a central role in the coordination of these organizations in their disaster preparedness, response, and recovery efforts.*

➤ **Structure:** *SF CARD serves as an intermediary agency dedicated to organizational disaster resilience, and is an essential link between the public sector first responders and the nonprofit and faith-based organizations in disaster response and recovery. ➤ **Goal:**  
 To improve community resiliency in the Bay Area before, during and after emergency events through an improved network of public-private partnerships.


➤ **Structure:**  
 Co-Chairs and Cross-Sector Summit Planning Committee, which changes annually; No formal membership currently, No dues for attending annual summits.

➤ **Current Activities:**  
 Host annual summits with discussions with critical resource and service providers and presentations on standardized protocols and procedures 1) to create opportunities for cross-sector collaboration and info-sharing for public, private, and non-profit organizations and 2) to improve organizational planning across sectors.
