### Internship Description

#### About the Organization:

Tailored internships are available in London at a wide range of organizations and companies. Students with an interest in **business, publishing, theater, journalism**, and other areas can apply and have an internship arranged for them in their area of interest if they qualify.

This option may be combined with a study abroad program, but you must plan ahead and apply to both programs together. Combining the program has important ramifications for credit, registration, financial aid, and visa requirements.

Past interns have worked at publishing companies, in theaters, at political think tanks, and at banks. Job descriptions vary widely by the area.

### Intern Qualifications

**Academic Background:**

Nearly any major is suitable for this internship provided the individual has a strong interest in international education and knowledge of the U.S. educational system.

**Skills/Experience:**

Applicants must be mature, well-spoken, and good at writing. Ability to work independently is a must. Some knowledge of the British education system would be helpful.

**Language Requirement:**

English

**Other Requirements:**

Interns are required to apply for the BUNAC card and have legal permission to work in the U.K (approximately \$275 for the card). Students should apply as early as possible for this internship.



## Internship Costs

**Program Fees:**

The program fee includes tuition, internship site development and placement, pre-departure orientation, international health insurance, internship monitoring and follow-up.

Note: The program fee does not include airfare, housing, living expenses or any other estimated costs noted below.

There is an additional fee of \$500 for tailored internships in London that covers a portion of the fee for your placement to be arranged and the assistance of an in-country coordinator.

**Note:**

Any financial or in-kind support provided by the host organization is explicitly indicated.

**Compensation:**

Most internships will be unpaid or may provide some compensation for local transportation and lunch.

**Accommodation:**

Accommodation in London is approximately £90-120 per week.

**International Travel:**

Approximately \$1000.

**Cost of Living:**

London is a very expensive city. Expect to spend approx. £450 per month in addition to rent. The following estimates are merely a guideline for a frugal lifestyle in London:

Monthly rent: £400

Meals: £250-300

Transportation £60

Miscellaneous £50

Entertainment £50

Interns must apply for a British work permit (Blue Card) through BUNAC (approximately \$275 prior to participating in the internship).
