- What about your community would you like to show people 500 years in the future? What would you like to have been able to see 500 years ago?

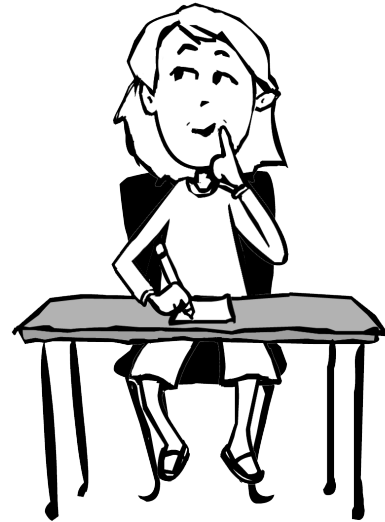
Call them out to your teacher to write on the board.
