National German Exam

We were honored to have two King of Kings' students participate in the annual National German Exam.

The National German Exam is administered each year to over 26,500 high school students of German. The Exam, now in its 57th year, provides individual feedback, rewards students through an extensive regional and national prize program, and creates a sense of accomplishment. The Exam is delivered in electronic format and has four levels, each with the same structure and content. Students who score in the 90th percentile can apply for the AATG/PAD Study Trip Award, which is a four-week study abroad trip to Germany! How was this exam unique to King of Kings? This is the first year that our school had the privilege of having talented students take this exam and they weren't even high schoolers!

Seventh-grader Madeira Wilde and sixth-grader Annika Hoefler were the two students chosen for this exam based on their German ability, and further
