

### Searching the Scriptures

The Scriptures are our guide to doctrine, reproof, correction and instruction in righteousness (2Tim. 3:16)

We should be like noble Bereans and search the Scriptures to properly understand the “New Testament” (Acts 17:10-11)

The only “Scriptures” at the time were the Tanak (“Old Testament”) as the “New Testament” books were still being written.

Everyone wants to know the answer to the question “What is Truth?” (Jn. 18:37-38)

The answer from “The Scriptures” is that “Torah is truth” (Ps. 119:142, 151)

Truth is something that we do (Jn. 3:20; Gal. 3:1; 2Jn. 1:4)

Truth has an enemy: HaSatan. (Jn. 8:44; Rev. 12:9, 17)

### For all Generations Forever

The Torah was given for all generations “forever” (Ex. 27:21; also 28:43; 29:28; 30:21; 31:17; : Lev. 6:18, 22; 7:34, 36; 10:9, 15; 17:7; 23:14, 21, 41; 24:3; Num. 10:8; 15:15; 18:8, 11, 19, 23; 19:10 and Deut. 5:29; Ps. 119:160)

The Torah cannot be diminished or taken from, any teacher who diminishes Torah is false (Deut. 4:2; 12:32-13:9)

Messiah did not come to abolish the Torah (Mt. 5:17-19; also Lk. 16:17)

Faith does not abolish Torah, we should uphold Torah. (Rom. 3:31)

### The Truth Makes us Free

The Truth shall make you free (Jn. 8:31-32)  
Walking in Torah is freedom (Ps. 119:44-45; James 1:25; 2:12)

False teachers bring false freedom in turning away from Torah, this is true bondage (2Pt. 2:19-22)

Messiah offers us a yoke that brings rest to our souls (Mt. 11:29-30) that yoke is Torah (Jer. 6:16, 19; Jer. 5:4-5; Jer. 2:20)

## Deliverance from Sin

What is Sin? Sin is transgression of the Torah. (1Jn. 3:4; also Lev. 5:17; 2Kn. 10:31; Ps. 119:10-11)

We need deliverance from Sin. (Is. 59:1-2)

Messiah came to deliver us from sin (Mt. 1:21) meaning that he came to “take away” sin (Jn. 1:29) meaning that he came to “take away” Torah transgression. He wants us to stop transgressing the Torah (Rom. 6:1-2)

WWJD: “What Would Jesus Do?” Messiah was Torah observant (Mt. 5:16-17; Heb. 4:15) and we should therefore walk as He walked. (1Jn. 2:6)

## What Can You Do?

Come visit us on Sabbath (the Seventh Day Ex. 20:8-11) and begin learning the Torah (Acts 15:21) Messiah went synagogue on Sabbath (Lk. 4:16) and we should walk as he walked (1Jn. 2:6)

In addition to studying Torah and keeping the Seventh Day Sabbath, there are seven basic laws derived from the first nine chapters of Genesis that you should start with:

1. Conduct yourself with justice- What is undesirable to yourself do not to others.
2. Bless the Name of YHWH and do not blaspheme.
3. Abstain from idolatry
4. Abstain from sexual Immorality
5. Abstain from murder
6. Abstain from theft
7. Abstain from consuming blood

As you continue to study, you will learn more of the Torah.
