

Triangle Climate & Landscape Researchers' Doggie Bag

Take-Home Info from the Brown Bag on September 12, 2013

Main Presentation

Dave Wear, co-project leader and economist with the USDA Forest Service, Southern Research Station presented the Southern Forest Futures Project (SFFP) at the most recent climate and landscape researchers' brown bag series. Joined by fellow researchers, students, and conservation professionals, Dr. Wear outlined this multi-year research effort to forecast changes in southern forests between 2010 and 2060 under various scenarios. Challenged to focus on issues of concern for on-the-ground resource managers, this project encompasses a comprehensive science-based "futuring" analysis based on input from numerous public meetings across 13 states in the Southeast. With the public's interest defined through the public meetings, the SFFP team was able to target the most important issues (or meta-issues), forecast conditions for land use, forest conditions, and forest uses under several possible "future" scenarios, and, identify several management implications for several subregions of the South. Phase I of the SFFP (a 17-chapter technical report and synthesis summary report highlighting the most critical findings) has been released, and can be found by [clicking here](#).
