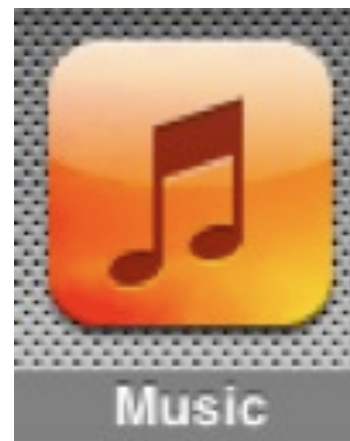

# What is guided reading?

## Guided Reading

-involves the teacher guiding students as they read, talk and think their way through a text.

# What are some purposes of guided reading?

**1. Comprehension** - predicting, asking questions, thinking out loud about reading, linking (books, self, world)

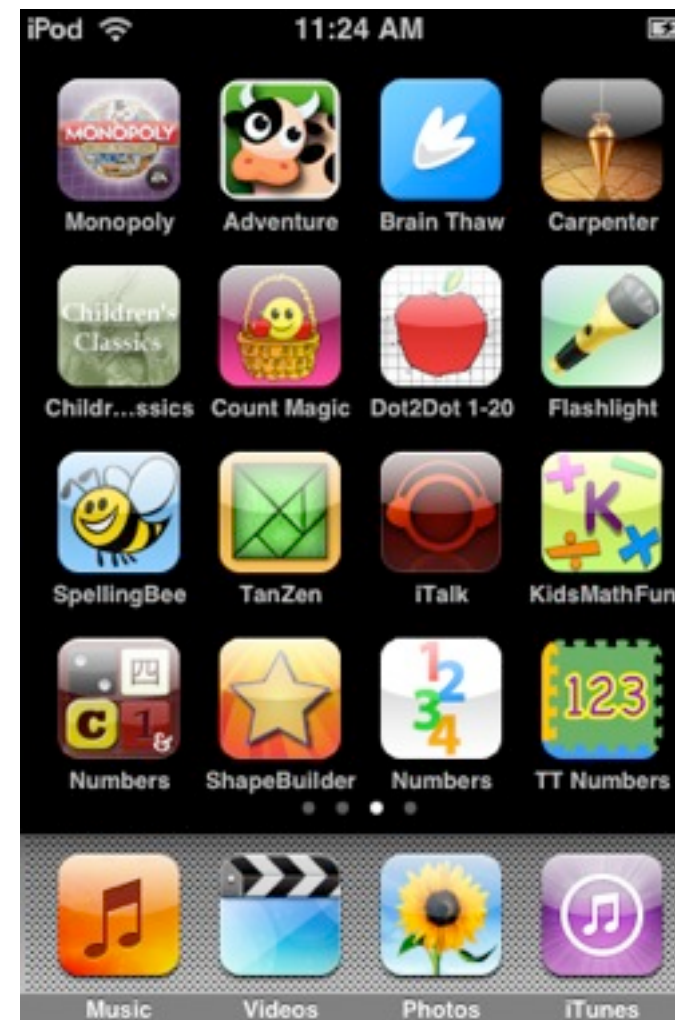
**2. Decoding strategies**

Visual, meaning, syntax, phonics, syllables, vocab

**3. Text features**

- grammar, spelling, paragraphs, headings etc

# Why have guided reading on the iPods?

# Use garageband or movie maker

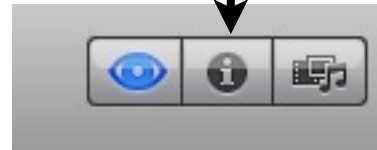


Add the pic to the podcast track

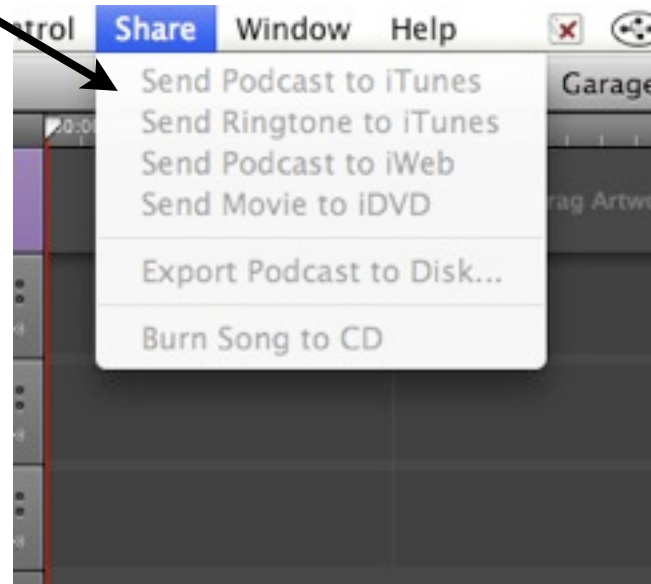


Add a jingle
