

Charter of Good Conduct

This Web Space is created to encourage further exchanges to promote Franco-Anglo-American business and cultural relations. MAABN promotes openness and transparency by giving members the possibility to share and connect which will be only constrained by limitations of law, MAABN's purpose and evolving social norms (see example restrictions below).

MAABN reserves the right to strike content that does not conform to the law, that does not respect the purpose of MAABN or current social norms and, if a member refuses to respect this Charter, to deny access to a member.

As an example of restrictions, members shall not:

- Upload or otherwise share any copyrighted or otherwise protected material if they do not own or lawfully enjoy the benefits of such rights. MAABN complies with the provisions of French law regarding unauthorized use of copyrighted material. - Send or otherwise post unsolicited commercial communications to users (such as spam and other malicious communications), or upload viruses or other malicious code.
- Solicit login information or access an account belonging to someone else, collect users' information, or otherwise access the Web Space, using automated means (such as harvesting bots, robots, spiders, or scrapers) without our permission.
- Bully, intimidate, or harass any user.
- Post content that is hateful, threatening, pornographic, or that contains nudity or graphic or gratuitous violence.
- Use the Web Space to do anything unlawful, misleading, malicious, or discriminatory.

This Web Space is for members only. Subject to the above and to technical limitations, Members should enjoy the following rights and freedoms:

- Members should have the freedom to share whatever information they want and have the right to connect online with any other member as long as they both consent to the connection.
- Members should own their information. They should have the freedom to share it with anyone other member and take it with them anywhere they want, including removing it from the Web Space.
