

## Kirk's Magic Glitter Liquid Frequently Asked Questions

### 1. What's in the liquid?

The liquid is solvent-based, non-flammable, and non-combustible. The glitter is solvent resistant, and it flows very fast in the liquid.

### 2. Why is the magic glitter liquid lower in the globe than a lava lamp's liquid?

The magic glitter liquid expands when heated. When it's heated and flowing, the liquid will rise up under the lamp's decorative cap.

### 3. What lamps will the magic glitter liquid run on?

It will run on virtually any glitter lamp that was ever made!

The magic glitter liquid runs on lamps that use 10w, 15w, 25w, 40w, and 100w bulbs.

### 4. How long can I run my magic glitter liquid?

The magic glitter liquid can run for a long time, but to ensure long life, **run time should be limited to 8 hours.**

The glitter liquid **works best between 65°–75° F/18°–24° C.**

### 5. Why does it take so long for the glitter to flow?

The time before a 32oz lamp is fully heated and flowing is usually 30–60 minutes. 52oz lamps take 60–90 minutes. Larger lamps like the Grande take 120 minutes. While it takes a little longer to flow than other fast glitter lamps, it flows longer and looks better!

### 6. What if I break my lamp and the liquid spills?

Wear gloves, and use paper towels to soak up the liquid. Since the liquid is solvent-based, water won't help to clean it up. Open a window and turn on a fan until the solvent smell is gone.

### 7. My glitter liquid used to flow great. Now, some or all of it just floats at the top. What's wrong?

The liquid isn't hot enough for the glitter to flow. Replace your bulb. In the case of the Wizard, Carlisle, and Blip lamps, adjust the socket so the bulb is closer to the bottom of the glass globe.

### 8. I noticed some of my magic glitter sitting on the bottom while the lamp is running. Is this a problem?

You have probably been running the lamp longer than the recommended 8 hours. Turn the lamp off, let it cool for a couple of hours, and then start it up again. Preserve the glitter and flow by letting them have a rest.

### 9. Can you fix my old vintage glitter lamps?

### 10. Do you offer other glitter sizes and shapes? Different colors?

### 11. I see you sell 32 oz globes. Do you have any 52 oz globes? Other sizes? Do you sell the whole lamp?

I usually have a couple of 52 oz globes in stock. I charge an additional \$10 each for them. I don't have the other sizes, but can probably get one, so please ask. I do have a few Wizard, Aristocrat, and Midnight-style bases and caps. There is an extra charge for them.
