## Tardy Policy Review

**Tardy:** Children not in their classrooms by 8:00 am are considered tardy. (The red flag signals this). Proceed directly to school office. Parents **MUST** accompany the child to be considered an excused tardy, otherwise the tardy will be marked as unexcused.

Any arrival after 9:00 am will be marked as partially absent.

If a tardy is the result of a doctor's visit, **ALWAYS** ask for a doctor's excuse for our files.

Common courtesy asks that you contact the teacher or school office if you know you'll be tardy.

Three tardies within one period results in a one-day suspension to be served the next school day. Preschool children are exempt from receiving suspensions, but must follow the tardy procedure.
