Frequently Asked Questions

I am not sure if I signed up for Raid, how can I tell?

A list of registered attendees is listed on the website.

How late can I sign up for Raid?

Please register once you decide you are coming. Pre-registration is not required, but it really helps us with our planning. You can just show up at the meet up locations.

How do I register for Raid?

Keep reading, instructions are a few lines down.

I prefer not to carry so much stuff on my scooter while traveling to Raid, is there any way to get my stuff there other than via scooter?

Yes, we have two equipment drops. We have an on sight drop on August 1, 2009 which is great for travel trailers and larger items and 8/5/09 equipment drop in Tigard. See Raid, Public Agenda on the events tab of the OSC website for details on how to have your equipment transported.

Will there be movies at this raid?

Yes on Saturday night. Our Movie Master for Raid 7 is Arjen Sundman. Send him an e-mail with your ideas for movies. Also thanks to Dave Seeley for supplying the screen.

I can't make it for the group ride out on Friday night, how else I can get there.

There is a ride from the Bomber Restaurant on Saturday morning at 9:00 AM. If you can't make any of the rides to the Raid, contact Rick Fletcher for an address and map. We are not publishing the address of the Raid on the OSC website.

Will chairs be available at the raid site?

We will have about 25 chairs, so bringing a chair might not be a bad idea.

What is the Oregon Scooter Raid 7?

The Oregon Scooter Raid is an annual OSC function. The primary activities are camping, scooter rides, scooter camaraderie, and a campfire.

Is the Raid a "members" only activity?

No. Non-members may attend by paying the fees for the Raid.

Where will the Raid be held?

The 2009 Raid will be held at the Kober Celebration Center, a private park owned by a member's family. It is approximately 6 miles south of Canby, Oregon.

What are the dates for the Raid?

Friday evening August 7, 2009 through Sunday afternoon, August 9, 2009.

How do I register for the Raid?

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Members may register by sending an e-mail to president@oregonscooterclub.org with their name and phone number and indicate they will attend.

Non-members and guest may register by sending an e-mail to president@oregonscooterclub.org with their name and phone number and send \$30.00 to via PayPal to treasurer@oregonscooterclub.org. If you are unable to use PayPal, please e-mail treasure@oregonscooterclub.org for payment instructions.

How many people attend Raid?

The last two years we have had approximately 45 people attend the Raid

Are children welcome?

Children are welcome, but Raid is not child friendly. No actives are planed for children and parents are solely responsible for attending their children. In the last two years, a few children have attended the Raid

What are the restroom faculties?

Sanitary commercial portable commercial toilets are provided.

Are shower faculties available?

No shower facilities are available on site. This is camping.

Are there cabins or sleeping faculties that can be rented?

No, this is a tent only camp facility.

Can I rent the Kober Celebration Center for my activity on a different date.

No. The Kober Celebration Center is not a commercial facility. It only available for activates sponsored by a Kober family member.

Do I have to ride a scooter to attend?

No. All are welcome at the Raid regardless of their riding abilities.

How much does Raid cost?

Raid fees are included in OSC membership dues. Non-members pay a \$30 fee for the entire weekend.

What facilities are near the Raid site?

The city of Molalla is 4.5 miles from the Raid site. Full service super markets, convenience markets, gas stations, and multiple restaurants are available.

What is the nearest medical facility?

There are urgent care centers in Molalla 4.5 miles away and in Canby, 7 miles away. Willamette Falls Hospital is 11 miles away. The Canby Fire Department provides ambulance services and is 7 miles away.

Is there mobile (cell) phone service at the Raid site?

Yes, most mobile phone providers have fair to good signal at the Kober Celebration Center.

Do I have to attend the entire Raid to participate?

No, you may come for all or part of the Raid.

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How long are the rides?

We are offering two rides on Saturday. A short ride of approximate 60 miles and a long ride of 182 miles. The long ride will have a slower group (45 MPH target top speed) and a faster group.

What do I need to bring to Raid?

A tent, bedding, sun block and bug juice (insect repellent) are the minimum items. A folding chair and pop-up sun awning will increase your comfort.

What food is provided at Raid?

- Dinner is provided Friday and Saturday
- Breakfast and lunch are provided on Saturday and Sunday
- There is self service peanut butter and jelly station available through out the raid.

Are any beverages provided?

- Juice, and coffee are provided in the mornings with breakfast
- Punch will be provide with the dinners
- A keg of beer is provided in the evenings. Beer is to be consumed only by persons over 21 years of age who are overnight guest and have finished all scooter riding/auto driving for the day. **Operation of a scooter/auto by persons under the influence of alcohol or drugs will not be tolerated. This is true regardless of who supplies the alcohol/drugs.**

Who runs the Raid?

The Oregon Scooter Club

Will other people/groups be using the Kober Calibration Center?

No. The OSC will be the only user of the Kober Celebration Center during Raid weekend.

Can I bring my own food?

Yes. A gas BBQ grill is available for your use.

Are pets allowed at the Raid?

Pets are not allowed at the Raid.

Is smoking allowed at the Raid?

Smoking is allowed, but to minimize the fire hazard, we ask that you do not walk around with lighted smoking material and have a bucket of water handy while smoking.

Do I have to go on the rides to participate in the Raid?

No. You may remain in camp at the Kober Celebration Center or engage in your own private activities.

How do current OSC members register for the Raid

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Current OSC members may send an e-mail to president@OregonScooterClub.org with your name, phone number and indicate that you are a member who will attend Raid.

How do non-members and member guest register and pay for Raid.

Non-members and member guest may send an e-mail to president@OregonScooterClub.org with your name, phone number and indicate that you are a non-member who will attend Raid. Instructions on how to pay the \$30 fee for attending Raid will be sent via return e-mail.

Do I need to bring my OSC membership card or receipt for raid payment with me to enter the Raid?

It is not necessary to bring your membership card or receipt with you. Upon arrival at the raid please check in at the registration table to receive your arm band. The Kober Celebration Center requires arm bands to be on the premises.
