The successful candidate will be expected to teach in the Human Anatomy and Physiology sequence and develop upper division physiology courses for science and health majors as well as a course in the faculty member's specialty area. The department currently supports coursework and undergraduate research opportunities in developmental physiology, neuroscience, and exercise/sport physiology. The new hire would complement these program areas and/or bring new opportunities for physiology education and research to the department. The Department of Biology is committed to increasing diversity within our department and the campus community. Candidates who demonstrate a commitment to working with diverse populations in STEM are especially encouraged to apply.

The Ph.D. degree in a relevant field is required and postdoctoral experience preferred. In addition, the successful candidate will: (1) be committed to teaching excellence and familiar with inclusive teaching practices and evidence-based pedagogical techniques, (2) develop a research program that is accessible to undergraduate students, (3) pursue external funding sources for their research program, (4) provide academic advising, and (5) engage in service to the Department, College, University, and greater higher education community.

Please submit a single PDF file consisting of the following items: (1) A **cover letter** explaining your interest in the position. (2) A **curriculum vitae**. (3) The names and contact information for three persons who will provide **letters of recommendation**. (4) A **teaching statement** with your philosophy of teaching, prior teaching experience, and specific examples of teaching effectiveness; if you have experience and/or interests in diversity initiatives in a higher education setting, please describe these therein. (5) **Recent teaching evaluations** from relevant courses, including a concise summary of the evaluations. (6) A **research statement** that addresses prior results, future plans, ways to involve undergraduates as collaborators, and equipment/supply needs. Recommendation letter writers listed on the *HireTouch* website will automatically be sent emails with specific directions about how and where to upload their official letters.
