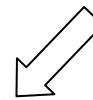

books. Raised and educated in Greenville, South Carolina, and Brooklyn, New York, Woodson graduated from college with a B.A. in English, and then worked in New York City as a drama therapist for runaways and homeless children. She now writes full-time in Brooklyn.



George Ella Lyon is the winner of the Appalachian Book of the Year Award for

her poetry collection *Catalpa*. She is also the author of three novels for young readers, nineteen picture books, and an autobiography. Many teachers throughout Michigan have used Lyon's work to inspire and engage their developing writers.
