

Nova Scotia Home for Colored Children (the "Home") Class Action Settlement

Claim Options : *Quick Guide

Option 1

Common Experience Payment

! if you resided at the Home **before** 1951 but never after 1951, you can only claim Option 1.

Option 2

Independent Assessment Process Payment

If you qualify for Option 1, you may qualify for Option 2.

What's the Difference?

The Common Experience Payment is an acknowledgment of aspects of your experience and symbolic compensation for former residents, for the harmful aspects of your shared experiences at the Home.

In addition to the common experience, some residents of the Home experienced more severe harm, harm beyond the common experience. A private and independent evaluation will be done with an expert in order to gain a holistic understanding of your experience and resulting harms.

How do I qualify?

✓	You are alive on June 3, 2014.	✓
✓	You lived at the Home between January 1, 1921 and December 31, 1989.	✓
✓	You did not opt-out.	✓
! If you resided at the Home before 1951 and at no point after 1951 , you can only claim for option 1.		! You can claim under option 2 only if you lived at the Home between November 1, 1951 and December 31, 1989 .

How do I claim?

How is Payment Calculated?

<p>The period of time that you resided at the Home will determine your payment.</p> <p>a) If resided less than 40 days: \$1,000.00</p> <p>b) If 40 days up to 1 year: \$10,000.00</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Claimants may receive either (a) or (b) but not both.</p> <p>c) If resided at least 1 year or more: \$3,000.00 per year, following the 1st year.</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Claimants who qualify for (b) can also qualify for (c).</p>	<p>Pain and Suffering Compensation</p>	<p>Your payment will be determined with a Claims Evaluator and based on harm you suffered at the Home and the lasting effects on your life.</p> <p>Level 1: Significant Harm: \$25,000.00 Level 2: Very Significant Harm: \$50,000.00 Level 3: Severe Harm: \$100,000.00 Level 4: Very Severe Harm: \$200,000.00</p>
No counselling costs.	Counseling Costs	<p>You may claim counselling costs:</p> <p>Level 1: up to \$2,000.00 Level 2: up to \$4,000.00 Level 3: up to \$6,000.00 Level 4: up to \$8,000.00</p>
No financial counselling.	Financial Counselling	<p>You have the option of seeking financial counselling at no cost.</p>
