Here are numbers from 1 to 10.

1 - un
2 - deux
3 - trois
4 - quatre
5 - cinq
6 - six
7 - sept
8 - huit
9 - neuf
10 - dix

Make sure you learn these ten basic numbers very well. They come in handy more than you'll think.

Part Two:

For part two we will learn about 11 through 20.

11 - onze
12 - douze
13 - treize
14 - quatorze
15 - quinze
16 - seize
17 - dix-sept
18- dix-huit
19 - dix-neuf
20 - vingt

Not too hard right? You even got a freebie with 17 to 19. Remember that you're literally saying "ten-seven" or "ten-eight". Can you guess what 19 would then be literally?

Next, for part 3, We'll do 21 to 30.

21 - 30
21 - vingt et un
22 - vingt-deux
23 - vingt-trois
24 - vingt-quatre
25 - vingt-cinq
26 - vingt-six
27 - vingt-sept
28 - vingt-huit
29 - vingt-neuf
30 - trente

Noticed anything? To say "21" you're literally saying "Twenty and one". It continues all the way

down to 29. You're saying Twenty + one, two, three, etc. This pattern is going to continue through out the rest of the number line.
