August 3, we will have County Executive Allan Kittleman in the pit.

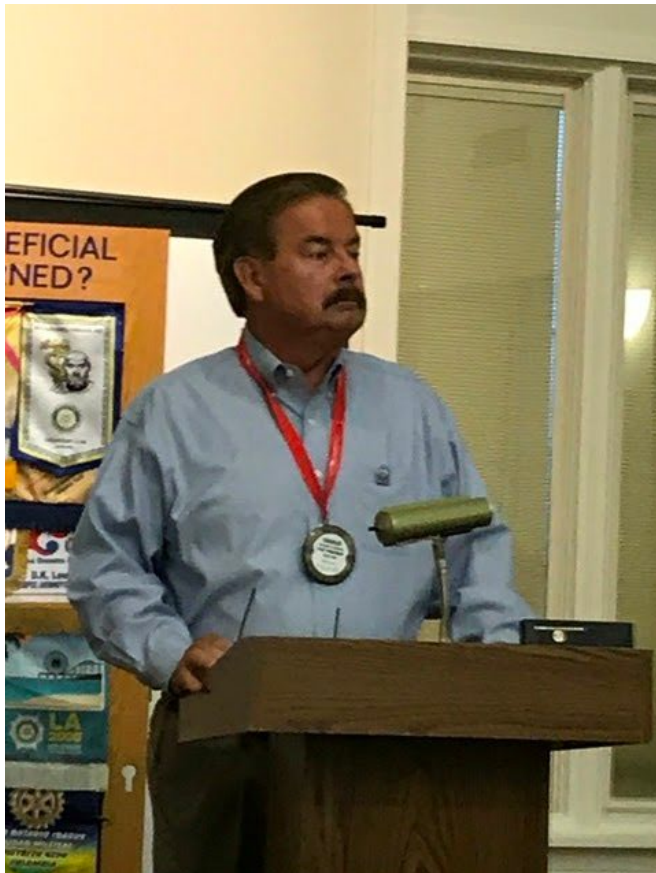
\$1,000 Grand Prize, Ravens and Orioles tickets will also be prizes.

RI was founded in 1905 by attorney, Paul Harris. In 16 years, Rotary expanded to 6 continents.

For more than 110 years, the RI guiding principles been the foundation of our values: service, fellowship, diversity, integrity, and leadership.

In 1986, our club, Rotary Club of Columbia-Patuxent, was founded. It was a mens only club. The Supreme Court ruled that RI is a business organization, and it cannot discriminate based on sex. We then started to admit women.

The purpose of the Rotary Leadership Institute (RLI) is to strengthen your club and strengthen your life. Rotary provides an opportunity for all of us to provide service to our community and throughout

the world. (Service Above Self) With that service comes a learning experience in the areas of leadership, team building, planning, marketing, communication and organization. RLI provides an opportunity to enrich that learning through sharing experiences and ideas with other Rotarians throughout the region.

The Rotaract Program is an incubator program to introduce 18-30 year olds to Rotary. Usually the groups are active in 4 year colleges. HCC is a difficult facility for Rotaract because it's a 2-year Junior College.

The Rotary Youth Exchange is a program where a teenager is totally immersed in a foreign country by a host family. We have sponsored a student who went to Germany for his Junior year of High School.

The RYLA, Rotary Youth Leadership Award, is a program to introduce the Rotary Principles to high school students.

If you donate your car to Melwood, 60% of the proceeds come back to our club, and 40% of the proceeds go to the District.

There are 6 cases worldwide of the wild polio virus, and 24 cases of the vaccine-induced virus.

RI is a 4-Star Charity. 91% of the money goes to the charity.

\$3 billion has been raised so far. The Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation has matched a 2:1 rate to the RI Foundation.

Our club's goal is \$200 per year.

We contributed \$13,252 last year, and \$265,000 over the years.
